HB 1693, A bill to be entitled An Act relating to documentation for the transfer of a motor vehicle title.

Amendment No. 1

Representative Dean offered the following amendment to **HB 1693**:

Amend **HB 1693** on third reading as follows:

(1) In SECTION 1 (page 1, line 9), between "vehicle" and "[~~sold~~]", insert "transferred".

(2) Strike SECTION 2 of the bill (page 2, line 13 through page 2, line 24).

(3) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION _____. Section 501.174, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (d), (e), and (f) to read as follows:

(b) Except as otherwise provided by this section, if [H] a law requires that a document be signed, the requirement is satisfied by an electronic signature.

(d) The department by rule shall establish a process to accept electronic signatures on secure documents which have been electronically signed through a system not controlled by the department.

(e) A system used for submitting electronic signatures to the department must verify the identity of the person electronically signing a document and submit the document through the electronic titling system.

(f) This section does not require the department to certify an electronic signature process or an electronic signature vendor before accepting a document that is executed with an electronic signature.

SECTION _____. Not later than January 1, 2019, the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles shall adopt rules necessary to implement Section 501.174(d), Transportation Code, as added by this Act.

HB 25 - STATEMENT FOR INCLUSION IN THE JOURNAL

Straight-ticket voting has been around in Texas since at least 1911. We believe that this sudden and unprovoked elimination of a voter's right to vote straight ticket would be unconstitutional. The supreme court recently chose not to take up *Johnson v. Michigan State A. Philip Randolph Institute*, a case in which the Sixth Circuit ruled that Michigan's law prohibiting straight-ticket voting was unconstitutional because it disproportionately burdened people of color. Additionally, Texas has developed a reputation for passing laws that intentionally discriminate against people of color's right to vote. In the last 12 months, courts have found Texas' voter ID law, congressional maps, and Texas state house maps all unconstitutional.

(c) This section does not apply to the return of any amount overpaid by a state agency to a vendor because of an incorrect contract, invoice, or other documentation.

(4) On page 5, lines 5-13, strike SECTION 1.08 of the bill.

(5) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTION to Article 1 of the bill:

SECTION _____. (a) The comptroller of public accounts shall conduct an interim study on the effectiveness of the process of barring vendors from participation in state contracts under Section 2155.077, Government Code. The study must include an evaluation of the risk to the state posed by vendors who receive low performance grades under Section 2262.055, Government Code, but who are not barred under Section 2155.077, Government Code.

(d) The person contracted under Subsection (b) shall maintain a record of each service provided under the medical transportation program, including the cost of mileage for the service, the cost of the service, and the cost of any software licensing support used to meet the requirements of this section. A managed transportation organization or vendor through which medical transportation program services are provided shall provide to the person contracted under Subsection (b) the information necessary for that person to comply with this subsection.

(e) Not later than December 1, 2018, the commission shall evaluate the oversight of medical transportation program services under this section for not more than a 90-day period to determine:

(1) the viability of continuing to contract with a person to oversee the services;

(2) the economic return on investment from contracting with a person to oversee the services; and

(3) route efficiency and reasonableness in the provision of the services.

(f) Subsection (e) and this subsection expire September 1, 2019.

(C) supports the collection of transactions fees from vendors;

(2) include consulting and marketing services;

(3) include authority to charge a vendor who participates in the project a one percent transaction fee to cover the costs of the project; and

(4) notwithstanding any other law, allow political subdivisions and non-profit organizations to make purchases through the project.

(c) The division of the governor's office having responsibility for budget and policy shall oversee the project.

(b) The Department of Information Resources, the comptroller of public accounts, and the five state agencies with the largest budgets on September 1, 2017, shall enter into a contract for a project to operate and manage state cooperative purchasing programs as provided by Section 2155.091, Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than October 31, 2017, and the project under that section shall be implemented not later than December 31, 2018.

(c) If the results of an assessment performed under Subsection (b) show estimated utility cost savings of at least 10 percent, the state agency shall have the Energy Systems Laboratory at Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station or another qualified provider prepare a plan for implementation of continuous commissioning or existing building commissioning practices and monitoring of the implementation for the state agency.

(d) If appropriated funds are unavailable for this purpose, a state agency may enter into a contract for the implementation of continuous commissioning or existing building commissioning practices for a facility to be paid for from the estimated savings in utility costs resulting from the implementation of the practices.

Specifically, Representative Springer asserts that the defined term "domestic animal" in Section 1 of the bill is not sufficiently described in the bill analysis. The point of order is overruled.

Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2), requires "an analysis of the content of the bill or resolution, including a separate statement that lists each statute or constitutional provision that is expressly repealed by the bill or resolution." Representative Springer contends that the failure to define the term "domestic animal" may lead to confusion as to the types of animals that are covered by the bill. During a lively discussion of the point of order, a number of domesticated animals and livestock were discussed. What was not discussed was how the bill analysis was incorrect or materially misleading.

In this case, "a horse is a horse, of course, of course." The phrase from the bill "domestic animal" is used properly in each place it appears in the bill analysis. The bill analysis is correct. Having reviewed the bill, the complete bill analysis, and the House Rules, the chair determines that the bill analysis satisfies the requirements of Rule 4, Section 32(c)(2).

(e) If after the hearing the board finds that annexation of the parcel into the district or exclusion of the parcel from the district would be feasible and would benefit the district, the board may approve the annexation or exclusion by a resolution entered in its minutes. The board is not required to include or exclude all of the parcel described in the petition if the board finds that a change is necessary or desirable.

(f) If the board of each district approves the transfer on the same terms, the districts may enter into an agreement to effectuate the transfer of territory as the boards agree and within a reasonable period of time. If a district from which territory is to be excluded under this section has outstanding debt or obligations, that district and the district to which the territory is to be added shall include in the agreement terms that ensure that the debts of the originating district are not impaired by the transfer of the territory.

CSHB 4122 - (consideration continued)**CSHB 4122 - REMARKS**

REPRESENTATIVE ISAAC: Groundwater conservation districts are charged to manage groundwater by providing for the conservation, preservation, protection, recharging, and prevention of waste of the groundwater resources within their jurisdictions—in other words, protecting our rights to our natural resources, our rights to water. There's the saying that my rights end where yours begin or more appropriately, as I've been dealing with over the last few years in the district I serve, where your fist ends and my nose begins. The water that runs through the

Blanco River and the Cypress Creek in Wimberley is spring fed, and the San Marcos River that starts in San Marcos in the district I serve is not just spring fed, it starts from a spring in the center of San Marcos. Those natural resources are very important to the people that I serve. That's why the people in Hays and Blanco counties are so concerned about our groundwater. I know many of you have heard from them recently. They feel like their right to their groundwater beneath the land is in jeopardy. They haven't come to the Capitol or called your offices because I asked them to; they've come on their own because this issue is that important to them. It is one of the most important issues in the district that I serve.

If you'll recall, **HB 4122** was filed on March 10, read, referred, and set for a hearing on March 31st, a day that we weren't actually physically in this chamber. But make no mistake about it. When originally filed, this bill was filed for a large landowner that has land in the Wimberley Valley in Hays County in the district that I serve. A landowner who, according to the *Statesman*, admitted to fighting my efforts last session for passage of **HB 3405**. Interesting, though, is that neither he nor a single representative for him testified in opposition to that bill or a companion at any stage ever. However, they did register either neutral or, in one case, in favor of this bill. How on earth was this one landowner fighting it? The same landowner has been meeting with colleagues; I'm sure you may have heard from some of them. One of them had a meeting in an office with one of our colleagues in the building just behind us to attempt to hijack other language to get that particular land that is in a groundwater conservation district out of any protections of a groundwater conservation district. And I have been told that efforts will continue to get that land out of a district and into a weaker district, whether that other district wants that land or not. And this will undo the protections that were passed last session to save our wells in Hays County.

Now, I will admit the bill before this body today is markedly, markedly improved from when it was originally filed, and I'm extremely grateful to Representative Kacal and Chairman Larson, the entire Natural Resources Committee, and the speaker's staff for their efforts to make this bill more palatable. It, again, is markedly improved since it was first filed, but I still have reservations about the precedent we're setting, especially in light of yesterday where we saw a bill passed by not the author. Should we allow large wealthy landowners to change counties, municipalities, school districts, because they simply don't like the one that they're in? Most people I know, when they want to do that, they move. What about a groundwater conservation district that was originally a flood control district, as Representative Cyrier and I have in Hays and Caldwell Counties, that's doing repairs on dams right now? What if a landowner in that flood control district wants to move to a district that doesn't have flood control authority and no way to repair those particular dams? What about subsidence districts in East Texas? These large landowners, in some cases, have more financial means than the districts themselves. What's going to happen to these districts when they're faced with neverending open records requests and lawsuits? What's going to happen when a landowner in the Edwards Aquifer Authority petitions to move to a groundwater conservation district because of the

precedent we may be setting with that? The lawsuits could cost the state millions and result in undoing a decades-old settlement that created the Edwards Aquifer Authority.

Members, this is opening Pandora's box and will lead to less protection of our natural resources. I support preserving our aquifers with uniform rules. I support protecting property rights. But this bill leaves too many questions unanswered. I believe it's a solution looking for a problem, especially since so many water attorneys across the state support its passage. Let's stop this now and work during the interim on uniform protections for the entirety of our aquifers, not a patchwork system that we have in place today. Let's do that during the interim and find a good solution that we can bring over the next 18 months to this body. With that, members, I urge you to vote no on the passage of **HB 4122**.

REPRESENTATIVE GOLDMAN: What this bill does?

GOLDMAN: It basically puts the numbers of barrels that were affected—in the original legislation it was 250,000 barrels. In the committee substitute it went down to 175,000 barrels, so it takes it back to 250.

E. RODRIGUEZ: It takes it back up to 250?

GOLDMAN: Yes, sir.

E. RODRIGUEZ: Thank you—or 225 is what I'm hearing?

GOLDMAN: Sorry, 225. My apologies; thank you.

AMENDMENT NO. 3 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE HINOJOSA: Representative Isaac, so is the intent of your amendment to allow someone who was at a brewery to purchase beer for personal consumption?

REPRESENTATIVE ISAAC: That's correct. It's only for personal consumption, so not for distribution. Again, these small breweries are handicapped at 5,000 barrels per year that they can sell in their tasting rooms. So this would just allow consumers that want to take a six pack with them home or out of state back to their friends and families to help market Texas beer. They would be able to do that if this amendment gets on this bill and this bill passes.

HB 3287 - REMARKS

REPRESENTATIVE E. RODRIGUEZ: I understand that you keep referring to that letter, but this bill, I believe, rolls back on some of that, what they initially supported. But that's my opinion of that. Are you aware that there was a petition, an online petition, that was going on for about 24 hours? Would you believe me if I said that there were over 8,000 signatures on this petition?

REPRESENTATIVE GOLDMAN: I was not aware of that petition, but Mr. Rodriguez, I can just see the logo there—that very logo of apparently the people who are passing around that petition were absolutely spreading complete misinformation about what this legislation does.

E. RODRIGUEZ: Well, someone could say that the distributors are doing the same thing, I guess.

GOLDMAN: That misinformation has been sent to every single member's office.

E. RODRIGUEZ: Well, someone could say that distributors are doing the same thing. I mean that's just the way it is.

GOLDMAN: Okay, do you have that, what misinformation there is from them?

E. RODRIGUEZ: No, I'm not saying that.

GOLDMAN: Okay, so you don't have any proof of that.

E. RODRIGUEZ: Well, I'm sure I can find something, I'm sure, that's been sent out there.

GOLDMAN: Well, I have—

E. RODRIGUEZ: By the way, my objection isn't about anything to do with the distributors. It's about the twenty-some odd breweries that I have in my district.

GOLDMAN: And this legislation affects your craft breweries in your district in no way, shape, or form. It does not change or impact their business in any way.

E. RODRIGUEZ: That can't be true when every one of them has contacted me saying this is a bad bill.

GOLDMAN: Okay, why did they think it's a bad bill?

E. RODRIGUEZ: For several reasons.

GOLDMAN: Tell me.

E. RODRIGUEZ: Well, one of them is, if I was a craft brewer and I decide to buy another brewery that this bill would allow for, even if I'm under that 225,000—after your amendment—cap, this bill would allow for me to have to go through a distributor.

GOLDMAN: No, that's not true.

E. RODRIGUEZ: On page 4, it's Section 4 of the bill, this bill would allow for, if I'm a craft brewer and I'm buying another one that's either, for whatever reason, and I'm still under the cap, I would still have to go through a distributor. And it very well could be an unintended consequence, but that's one of many issues with this bill. And if you want to talk about it further, we can do that.

GOLDMAN: I'm sorry. No, go ahead.

E. RODRIGUEZ: Well, that's one of the concerns. I don't know if you want to talk about that. We can get a correcting amendment, try to fix that. I'm sure that's not your intent.

GOLDMAN: It's not my intent at all. Again, there's no intent to shut any craft brewery down if they are bought by a mega brewer—in several cases in the state, international brewers moving forward. The four that we know of in the state who have been purchased recently in the last year since 2013 are completely grandfathered in this legislation. Nothing changes with them. In the future, if you're purchased by a mega brewer, mainly international brewers who are coming into our state and buying craft beers or brewpubs, yes, you will have to go through the distribution process just like everybody else.

And the point—let me explain, Mr. Rodriguez. The point is, and this is why I say this legislation is here to protect the craft brewer, when you're purchased by an Anheuser-Busch or you're purchased by a MillerCoors, now internationally-owned major brewers, you're no longer a craft beer. You're no longer considered. You're one of the big boys. And so our craft beers and our brewpubs in this state, our little guys, are competing with these mega international companies with a massive group of money and marketing behind them to promote their now so-called craft beer. That's no longer craft beer—that's what I'm saying. I applaud all the individuals who have come up with recipes in their kitchens or wherever and then been able to make it. Their entrepreneurship of it is wonderful.

E. RODRIGUEZ: But my problem with this bill is, I don't believe it makes that distinction between these international and trying to make it sound like it's all the Anheuser-Busches and all that kind of stuff. I don't think it makes that distinction in this bill.

GOLDMAN: That's who's coming in and buying these.

E. RODRIGUEZ: I could have Live Oak, which is a brewery which is in my district by the airport, wanting to buy another brewery. Under this bill, even if they're under that cap, this would allow for them to have to go through that system.

GOLDMAN: I don't believe that's true.

E. RODRIGUEZ: I'll find it for you when we have more time, and I'll show you that.

(1) may only charge the brewer the actual and verifiable costs incurred in distributing the ale to the brewer under that subsection; and

(2) must provide to the commission auditable annual financial records to support the amounts charged under Subdivision (1).

(2) On Page 6, between lines 10 and 11, insert the following:

(e) The holder of a license issued under Chapter 64, 65, or 66 who sells beer to a manufacturer under Subsection (d):

(1) may only charge the manufacturer the actual and verifiable costs incurred in distributing the beer to the manufacturer under that subsection; and

(2) must provide to the commission auditable annual financial records to support the amounts charged under Subdivision (1).
